

Privacy Policy

IP addresses and cookies

Corps Security as the Data Controller, may collect information about your computer, including where available your IP address, operating system browser type, and country of origin for system administration and to report aggregate information to our partners. This is statistical data about our users' browsing actions and patterns, and does not identify any individual.

The purpose of a cookie is to tell the web server that you have returned to a specific web page. For example, if you personalise web pages, or register for products or services, a cookie helps the web page server to recall your specific information. This may be useful to simplify the process of recording your personal information, such as billing addresses, shipping addresses, and so on. When you visit the same web site, the information you previously provided can be retrieved, so you can easily use the web site features that you previously chose.

We do not make use of any information in found in cookies.

Important: Cookies cannot be used to run code (run programs) or to deliver viruses to your computer.

CV's

We gather and store CV's from our web site for the sole purpose of filling the advertised vacancies, or offering alternative employment where applicable. These CV's are then processed by our recruitment staff, who may or may not get in contact with you by email, telephone or in writing regarding a vacancy. Paper copies of CV's that do not meet our criteria are destroyed and electronic versions are purged from our systems every 6 months.

Where we store your personal data

The data that we collect from you will not be transferred to, or stored at, a destination outside the European Economic Area ("EEA"). It will only be stored and processed by staff operating inside the EEA who work for us. By submitting your personal data, you agree to this storing or processing. We will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this privacy policy.

Where we have given you (or where you have chosen) a password which enables you to access certain parts of our site(s), you are responsible for keeping this password confidential. We ask you not to share a password with anyone.

Unfortunately, the transmission of information via the internet is not completely secure. Although we will do our best to protect your personal data, we cannot guarantee the security of your data transmitted to our site(s); any transmission is at your own risk. Once we have received your information, we will use strict procedures and security features to try to prevent unauthorised access.

Uses made of the information

We use information held about you in the following ways:

- To ensure that content from our site(s) is presented in the most effective manner for you and for your computer.
- To provide you with information, products or services that you request from us or which we feel may interest you, where you have consented to be contacted for such purposes.
- To carry out our obligations arising from any contracts entered into between you and us.
- To allow you to participate in interactive features of our service, when you choose to do so.
- To notify you about changes to our service.

We may also use your data, to provide you with information about vacancies which may be of interest to you and we may contact you about these by telephone.

Disclosure of your information

We may disclose your personal information to any member of our group, which means our subsidiaries, our ultimate holding company and its subsidiaries, as defined in section 736 of the UK Companies Act 1985.

We may disclose your personal information to third parties:

- In the event that we sell or buy any business or assets, in which case we may disclose your personal data to the prospective seller or buyer of such business or assets.
- If we or substantially all of our assets are acquired by a third party, personal data held by the Company, and that held about its customers, employees and prospective employees will be deemed one of the transferred assets.
- If we are under a duty to disclose or share your personal data in order to comply with any legal obligation, or in order to enforce or apply our terms of use or standard terms and conditions of business and other agreements; or to protect the rights, property, or safety of the Corps of Commissionaires Management Limited, our customers, or others. This includes exchanging information with other companies and organisations for the purposes of fraud protection and credit risk reduction.

Your rights

You have the right to ask us not to process your personal data for marketing purposes. We will usually inform you (before collecting your data) if we intend to use your data for such purposes or if we intend to disclose your information to any third party for such purposes.
